Listen to our latest PiCC Pulse episode where Lisbeth talks with another patient advocate about what is patient engagement and why is it important.

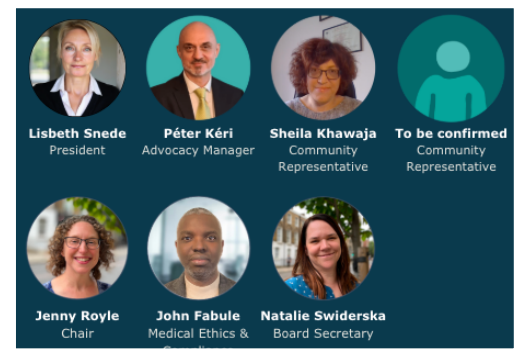

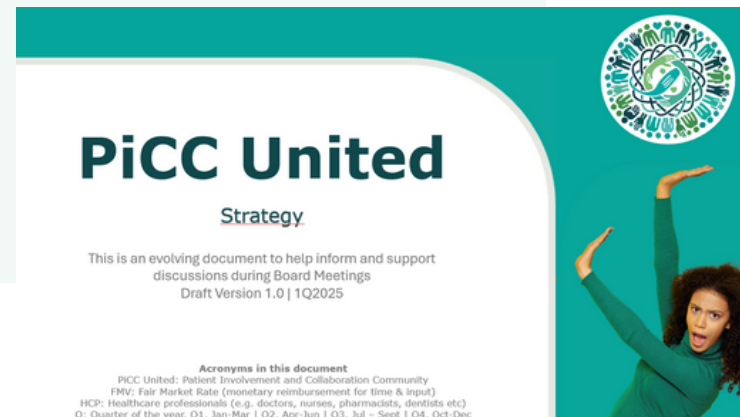


Working out a way forward - Our 5 year Strategy

At the WHO reception, Péter delivered a message that resonated deeply "Corruption is not culture – and trauma is not tradition. Sovereignty is not forced isolation."

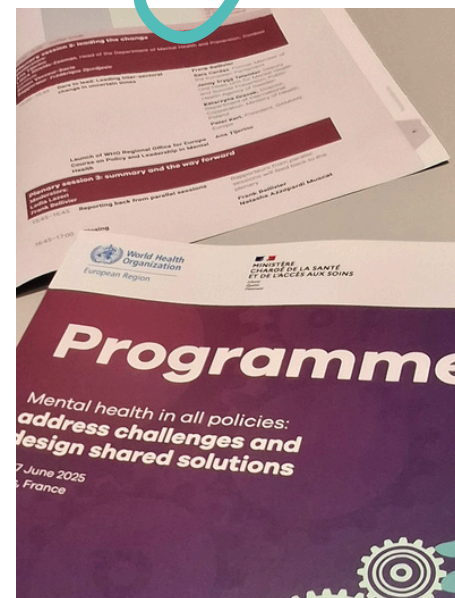
Our movement keeps growing – because our members are not just part of it. They embody it.
